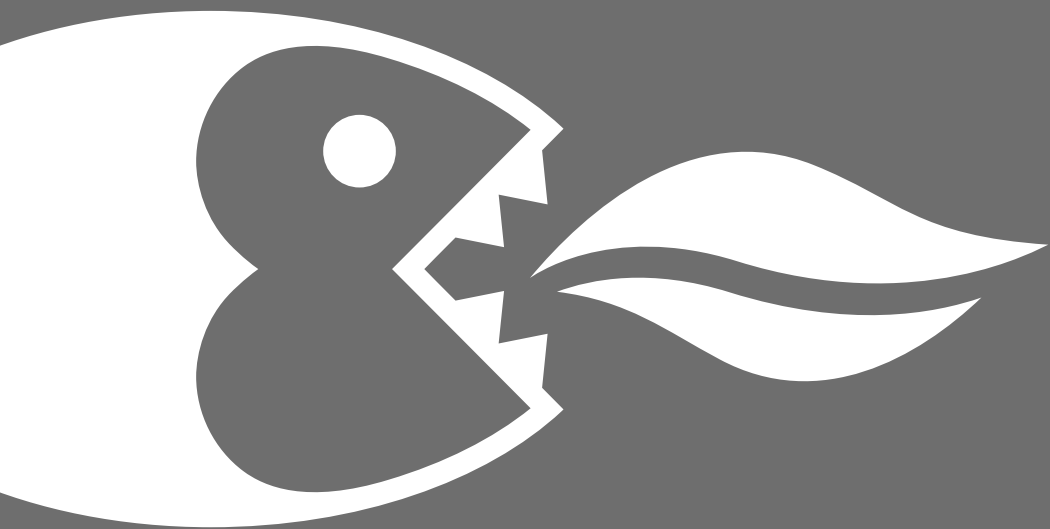

1 Safety warnings

1.1 Warning



Warning: risk of fire / flammable materials

This appliance is intended to be used in household and similar applications such as staff kitchen areas in shops, offices and other working environments; farm houses and by clients in hotels, motels and other residential type environments; bed and breakfast type environments; catering and similar non-retail applications.

If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, its service agent or similarly qualified persons in order to avoid a hazard.

Do not store explosive substances such as aerosol cans with a flammable propellant in this appliance.

The appliance has to be unplugged after use and before carrying out user maintenance on the appliance.

WARNING: Keep ventilation openings, in the appliance enclosure or in the built-in structure, clear of obstruction.

WARNING: Do not use mechanical devices or other means to accelerate the defrosting process, other than those recommended by the manufacturer.

WARNING: Do not damage the refrigerant circuit.

WARNING: Do not use electrical appliances inside the food storage compartments of the appliance, unless they are of the type recommended by the manufacturer.

WARNING: Please abandon the refrigerator according to local regulators for its use flammable blowing gas and refrigerant.

WARNING: When positioning the appliance, ensure the supply cord is not trapped or damaged.

WARNING: Do not locate multiple portable socket-outlets or portable power supplies at the rear of the appliance.

Do not use extension cords or ungrounded (two prong) adapters.

DANGER: Risk of child entrapment. Before you throw away your old refrigerator or freezer:

- Take off the doors,
- Leave the shelves in place so that children may not easily climb inside.

The refrigerator must be disconnected from the source of electrical supply before attempting the installation of accessory.

Refrigerant and cyclopentane foaming material used for the refrigerator are flammable. Therefore, when the refrigerator is scrapped, it shall be kept away from any fire source and be recovered by a special recovering company with corresponding qualification other than be disposed by combustion, so as to prevent damage to the environment or any other harm.

This appliance is not intended for use by persons (including children) with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge, unless they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance by a person responsible for their safety.)

Children should be supervised to ensure that they do not play with the appliance.

The instructions shall include the substance of the following: To avoid contamination of food, please respect the following instructions:

- Opening the door for long periods can cause a significant increase of the temperature in the compartments of the appliance.
- Clean regularly surfaces that can come in contact with food and accessible drainage systems.
- Store raw meat and fish in suitable containers in the refrigerator, so that it is not in contact with or drip onto other food.
- If the refrigerating appliance is left empty for long periods, switch off, defrost, clean, dry, and leave the door open to prevent mould developing within the appliance.

WARNING:

This appliance contains R600a refrigerant which is flammable.

It is hazardous for anyone other than an Authorised Service Person to service this appliance. In Queensland, the authorised Service Person **MUST** hold a Gas Work Authorisation for hydrocarbon refrigerants, to carry out Servicing or repairs where the gas system is being opened or charged.

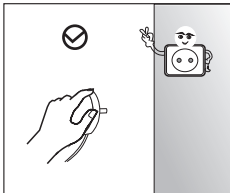

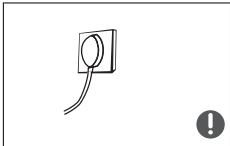

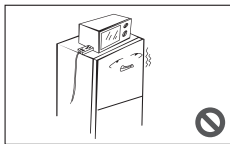
1. 3 Electricity related warnings



- Do not pull the power cord when pulling the power plug of the refrigerator. Please firmly grasp the plug and pull out it from the socket directly.
- To ensure safe use, do not damage the power cord or use the power cord when it is damaged or worn.
- If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, its service agent or similarly qualified persons in order to avoid a hazard.

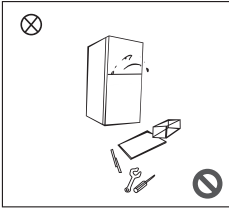


- Please use a dedicated power socket and the power socket shall not be shared with other electrical appliances. The power plug should be firmly contacted with the socket or else fires might be caused.
- Please ensure that the grounding electrode of the power socket is equipped with a reliable grounding line.

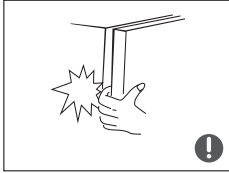


- Do not use electrical appliances on the top of the appliance, unless they are of the type recommended by the manufacturer.

1.4 Warnings for using



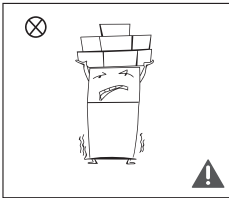
- Do not arbitrarily disassemble or reconstruct the refrigerator, nor damage the refrigerant circuit; maintenance of the appliance must be conducted by a specialist
- Damaged power cord must be replaced by the manufacturer, its maintenance department or related professionals in order to avoid danger.



- The gaps between refrigerator doors and between doors and refrigerator body are small, be noted not to put your hand in these areas to prevent from squeezing the finger. Please be gentle when close the refrigerator door to avoid falling articles.
- Do not pick foods or containers with wet hands in the freezing chamber when the refrigerator is running, especially metal containers in order to avoid frostbite.

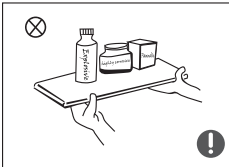


- Do not allow any child to get into or climb the refrigerator; otherwise suffocation or falling injury of the child may be caused.

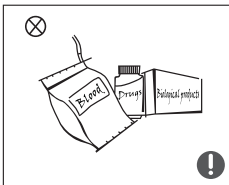


- Do not place heavy objects on the top of the refrigerator considering that objectives may fall when close or open the door, and accidental injuries might be caused.
- Please pull out the plug in case of power failure or cleaning. Do not connect the freezer to power supply within five minutes to prevent damages to the compressor due to successive starts.

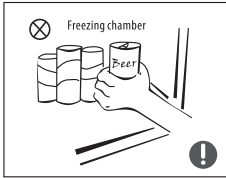
1.5 Warnings for placement



- Do not put flammable, explosive, volatile and highly corrosive items in the refrigerator to prevent damages to the product or fire accidents.
- Do not place flammable items near the refrigerator to avoid fires.



- The refrigerator is intended for household use, such as storage of foods; it shall not be used for other purposes, such as storage of blood, drugs or biological products, etc.



- Do not store beer, beverage or other fluid contained in bottles or enclosed containers in the freezing chamber of the refrigerator; otherwise the bottles or enclosed containers may crack due to freezing to cause damages.

1.6 Warnings for energy

- 1) Refrigerating appliances might not operate consistently (possibility of defrosting of contents or temperature becoming too warm in the frozen food compartment) when sited for an extended period of time below the cold end of the range of temperatures for which the refrigerating appliance is designed.
- 2) The fact that effervescent drinks should not be stored in food freezer compartments or cabinets or in low-temperature compartments or cabinets, and that some products such as water ices should not be consumed too cold;
- 3) The need to not exceed the storage time(s) recommended by the food manufacturers for any kind of food and particularly for commercially quick-frozen food in food-freezer and frozen-food storage compartments or cabinets;
- 4) The precautions necessary to prevent an undue rise in the temperature of the frozen food while defrosting the refrigerating appliance, such as wrapping the frozen food in several layers of newspaper.
- 5) The fact that a rise in temperature of the frozen food during manual defrosting, maintenance or cleaning could shorten the storage life.
- 6) The necessity that, for doors or lids fitted with locks and keys, the keys be kept out of the reach of children and not in the vicinity of the refrigerating appliance, in order to prevent children from being locked inside

1.7 Warnings for disposal

Refrigerant and cyclopentane foaming material used for the refrigerator are flammable.

Therefore, when the refrigerator is scraped, it shall be kept away from any fire source and be recovered by a special recovering company with corresponding qualification other than be disposed by combustion, so as to prevent damage to the environment or any other harm.

When the refrigerator is scraped, disassemble the doors, and remove gasket of door and shelves; put the doors and shelves in a proper place, so as to prevent trapping of any child.

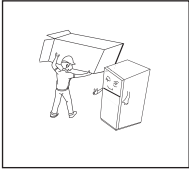

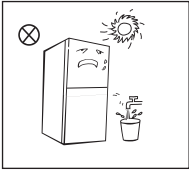

2 Proper use of refrigerators

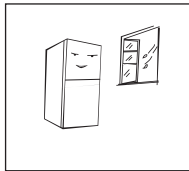
2. 1 Placement



- Before use, remove all packing materials, including bottom cushions, foam pads and tapes inside of the refrigerator; tear off the protective film on the doors and the refrigerator body.

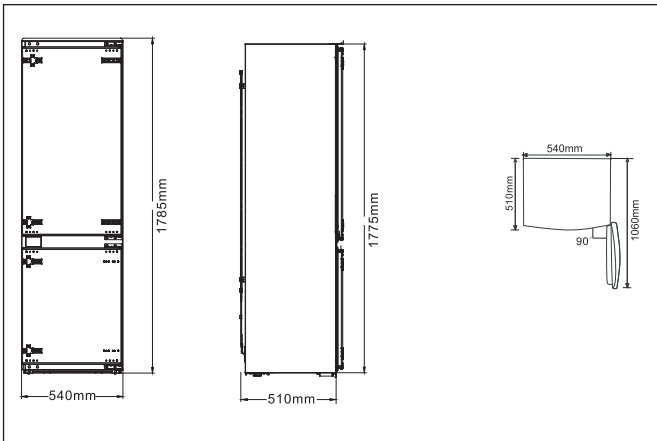


- Keep away from heat and avoid direct sunlight. Do not place the freezer in moist or watery places to prevent rust or reduction of insulating effect.
- Do not spray or wash the refrigerator; do not put the refrigerator in moist places easy to be splashed with water so as not to affect the electrical insulation properties of the refrigerator.



- Ensure the refrigerator is placed in a well-ventilated indoor place; the ground shall be flat, and sturdy.

Outer Cabinet Dimensions

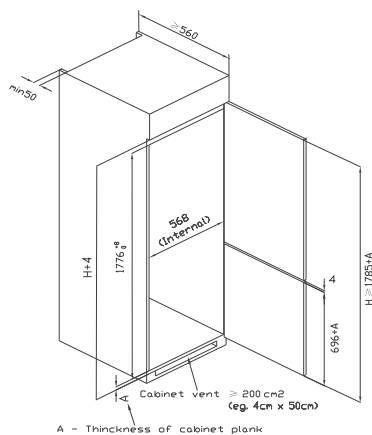

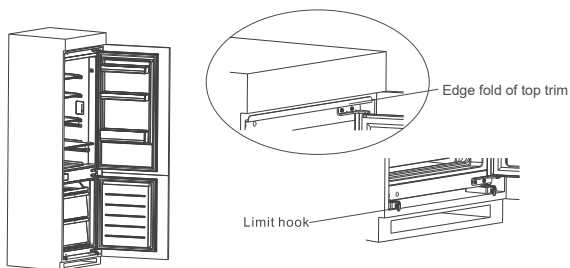

2. 2 Installation in cabinet

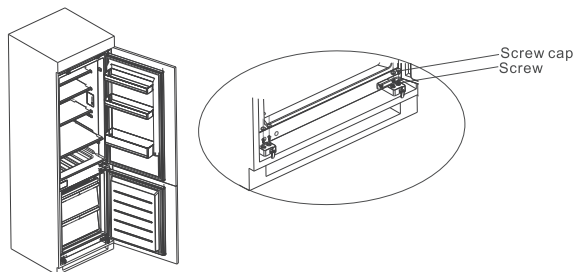
- Cabinet size requirements



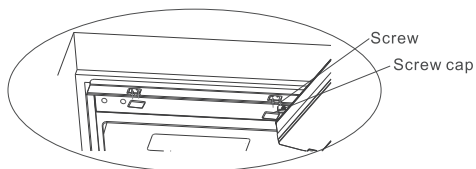
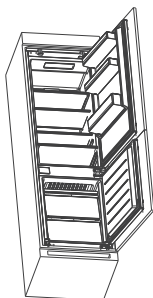
- Push the refrigerator into the cabinet ensuring the edge fold of the top trim is hard against the top edge of the cabinet and the limit hooks on the lower front supports are hard against the bottom edge of the cabinet.
- Before fixing into place, check the gap for the sealing strip between the cabinet and the refrigerator is correct.



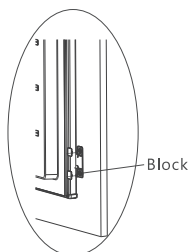
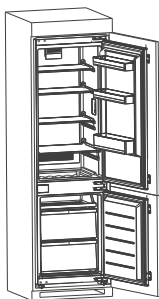
- Fix the lower front supports with screws, then install the screw caps.



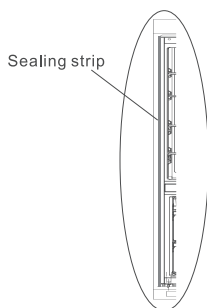
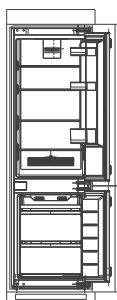
- Fix the top trim to the top edge of the cabinet with screws, then install the screw caps.







- Open the lower door of the cabinet to the maximum angle and the lower door of the refrigerator to the corresponding position.
- Slide the blocks onto the door brackets and position the screw holes just past the edge of the refrigerator door.
- Fix the blocks to the cabinet door with screws, then install the caps.
- Fix the upper refrigerator door to the cabinet door using the same method.



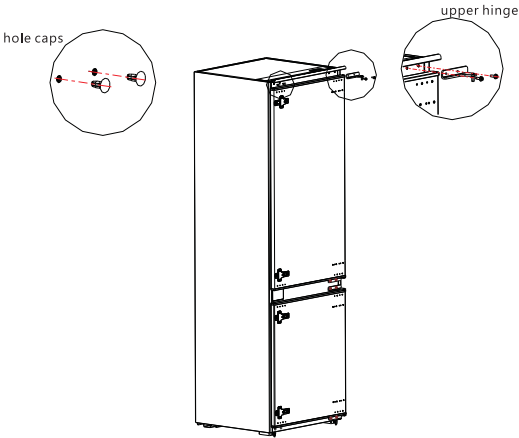
- Press the sealing strip into the gap between the cabinet and the refrigerator. Installation is complete.



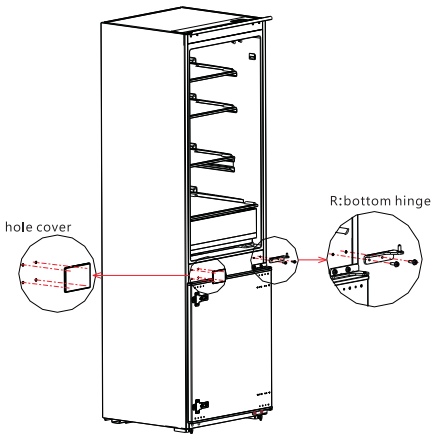
2. 3 Door Right-Left Change

- 1) Power off the refrigerator, and remove all objects from the door trays.
- 2) Remove the upper hinge and hole caps of refrigerator door.

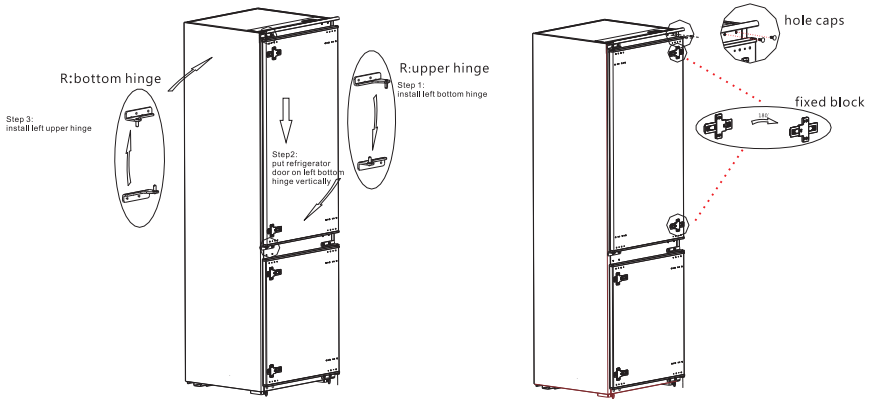


- 3) Remove the refrigerator door, the bottom hinge and the hole cover.

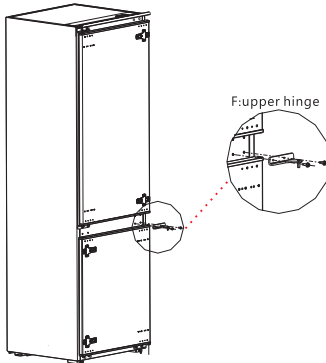


4) Exchange the R:bottom hinge and R:upper hinge , then install them according to below steps, and install the top hole caps.

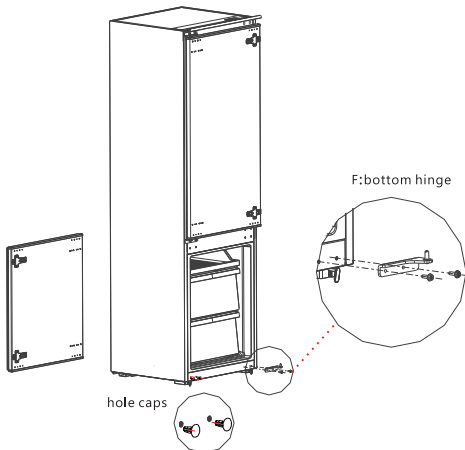
5) Remove the two fixed blocks of refrigerator door and rotate them for 180° , and install them on other side of refrigerator door.



6) Remove the the upper hinge of freezer door.

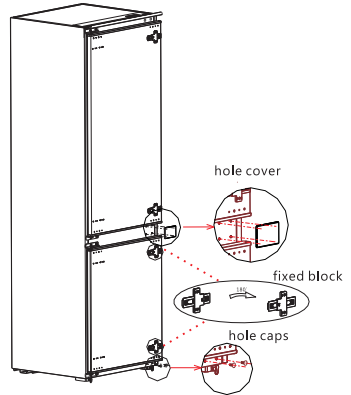
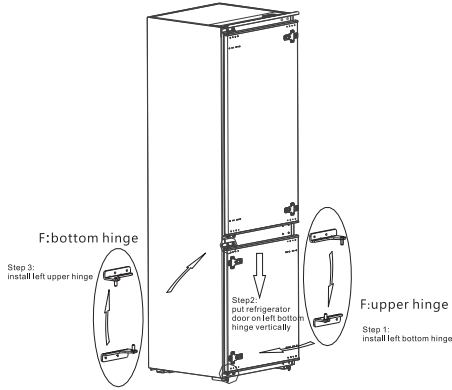


7) Remove the freezer door, the bottom hinge and the hole caps.

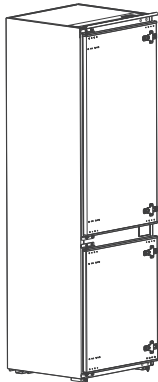


8) Exchange the F:bottom hinge and F:upper hinge , then install them according to below steps, and install the top hole cover and lower hole caps.

9) Remove the two fixed blocks of freezer door and rotate them for 180° , and install them on other side of freezer door.



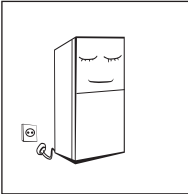
10) The picture after completion is shown as below



2.4 Changing the Light

Any replacement or maintenance of the LED lamps is intended to be made by the manufacturer, its service agent or similar qualified person.

2.5 Starting



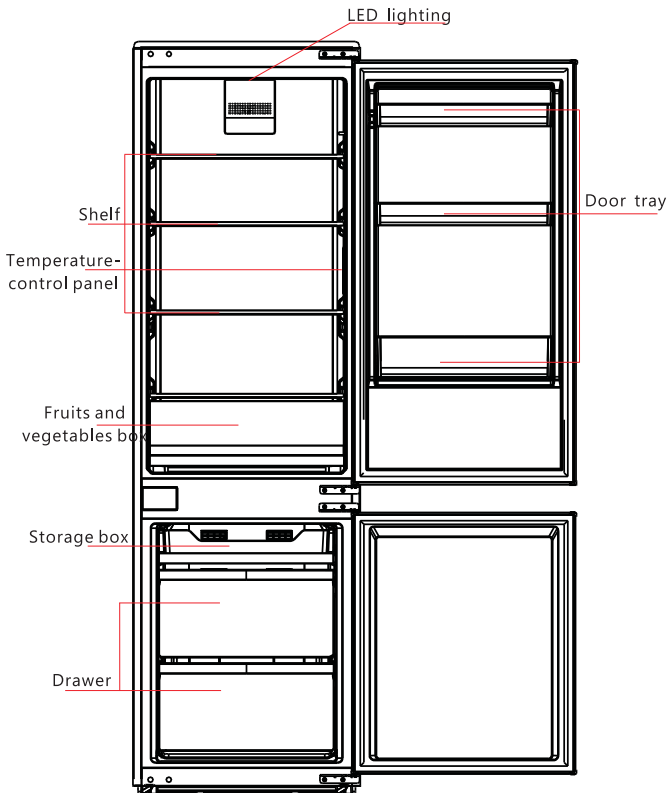
- Before initial start, keep the refrigerator still for half an hour before connecting it to power supply.
- Before putting any fresh or frozen foods, the refrigerator shall have run for 2-3 hours, or for above 4 hours in summer when the ambient temperature is high.

2.6 Energy saving tips

- The appliance should be located in the coolest area of the room, away from heat producing appliances or heating ducts, and out of the direct sunlight.
- Let hot foods cool to room temperature before placing in the appliance. Overloading the appliance forces the compressor to run longer. Foods that freeze too slowly may lose quality, or spoil.
- Be sure to wrap foods properly, and wipe containers dry before placing them in the appliance. This cuts down on frost build-up inside the appliance.
- Appliance storage bin should not be lined with aluminum foil, wax paper, or paper toweling. Liners interfere with cold air circulation, making the appliance less efficient.
- Organize and label food to reduce door openings and extended searches. Remove as many items as needed at one time, and close the door as soon as possible.

3 Structure and functions

3.1 Key components



Refrigerating chamber

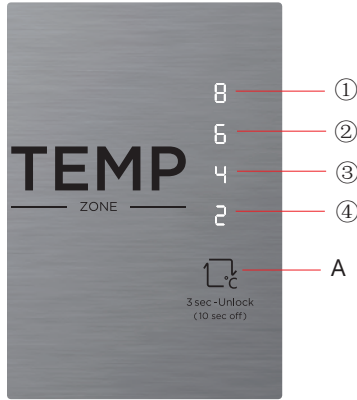
- The Refrigerating Chamber is suitable for storage of a variety of fruits, vegetables, beverages and other food consumed in the short term.
- Cooking foods shall not be put in the refrigerating chamber until cooled to room temperature.
- Foods are recommended to be sealed up before putting into the refrigerator.
- The glass shelves can be adjusted up or down for a reasonable amount of storage space and easy use.

Freezing chamber

- The low temperature freezing chamber may keep food fresh for a long time and it is mainly used to store frozen foods and making ice.
- The freezing chamber is suitable for storage of meat, fish, rice balls and other foods not to be consumed in short term.
- Chunks of meat are preferably to be divided into small pieces for easy access. Please be noted food shall be consumed within the shelf time.

Note: Storage of too much food during operation after the initial connection to power may adversely affect the freezing effect of the refrigerator. Foods stored shall not block the air outlet; or otherwise the freezing effect will also be adversely affected.

3.2 Functions



1) Key

A. Set key (Temperature setting button of refrigerator compartment)

2) Display screen

- ① setting 1: 8°C
- ② setting 2: 6°C
- ③ setting 3: 4°C
- ④ setting 4: 2°C

3) Display

Once initially powered on, the display screen is on full display for 3s. and then the refrigerator runs according to setting 3.

Normal operation display

In case of a failure, the corresponding LED blinks.

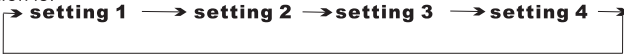
In case of no failures, it shows the actual temperature setting of refrigerator.

Fault Code	Fault Description
indicator setting 1	Refrigerator temperature sensor circuit
indicator setting 2	Refrigerator defrost sensor

4) temperature setting

Each time the temperature setting button A is pressed once, the temperature setting changes one time. After the temperature setting has been completed, the refrigerator will run according to the set value after 30s.

The shift regulation is:



5) Lock/Unlock

When the temperature control panel is in lock state, it needs to long press temperature setting key for 3 seconds for unlocking the panel, all LEDs will blink for 2 second when panel is unlocked.

When the temperature control panel is in unlock state, if there is no operation on control panel within 30 seconds, it will enter into lock state automatically.

6) Power off function

① entry mode:

In the unlocking state, set the key SET for 10S (when the display and control of the refrigerator are all off, the SET button will take effect when the key is released). After 30S, the refrigerator will enter the power off function mode, all loads are turned off, and the display and control of the refrigerator will be all off in the power off mode.

② exit method:

In power off mode, press the SET key to exit the power off mode and the refrigerator will return to normal control.

4. Maintenance and care of the refrigerator

4.1 Overall cleaning

- Dusts behind the refrigerator and on the ground shall be regularly cleaned to improve the cooling effect and energy saving.
- Check the door gasket regularly to make sure there are no debris. Clean the door gasket with a soft cloth dampened with soapy water or diluted detergent.
- The interior of the refrigerator should be cleaned regularly to avoid odour.
- Please turn off the power before cleaning interior, remove all foods, drinks, shelves, drawers, etc.
- Use a soft cloth or sponge to clean the inside of the refrigerator, with two tablespoons of baking soda and a quart of warm water. Then rinse with water and wipe clean. After cleaning, open the door and let it dry naturally before turning on the power.
- For areas that are difficult to clean in the refrigerator (such as narrow sandwiches, gaps or corners), it is recommended to wipe them regularly with a soft rag, soft brush, etc. and when necessary, combined with some auxiliary tools (such as thin sticks) to ensure no contaminants or bacteria accumulation in these areas.
- Do not use soap, detergent, scrub powder, spray cleaner, etc., as these may cause odors in the interior of the refrigerator or contaminated food.
- Clean the bottle frame, shelves and drawers with a soft cloth dampened with soapy water or diluted detergent. Dry with a soft cloth or dry naturally.
- Wipe the outer surface of the refrigerator with a soft cloth dampened with soapy water, detergent, etc., and then wipe dry.
- Do not use hard brushes, steel wool, wire brushes, abrasives (such as toothpastes), organic solvents (such as alcohol, acetone, banana oil, etc.), boiling water, acid or alkaline items, which may damage the fridge surface and interior. Boiling water and organic solvents such as benzene may deform or damage plastic parts.
- Do not rinse directly with water or other liquids during cleaning to avoid short circuits or affect electrical insulation after immersion.



⚠ Please unplug the refrigerator for defrost and cleaning.

4.2 Defrosting

- The refrigerator is made based on the air-cooling principle and thus has automatic defrosting function. Frost formed due to change of season or temperature may also be manually removed by disconnection of the appliance from power supply or by wiping with a dry towel.

4.3 Out of operation

- Power failure: In case of power failure, even if it is in summer, foods inside the appliance can be kept for several hours; during the power failure, the times of door opening shall be reduced, and no more fresh food shall be put into the appliance.
- Long-time nonuse: The appliance shall be unplugged and then cleaned; then the doors are left open to prevent odour.
- Moving: Before the refrigerator is moved, take all objects inside out, fix the glass partitions, vegetable holder, freezing chamber drawers and etc. with tape, and tighten the leveling feet; close the doors and seal them with tape. During moving, the appliance shall not be laid upside down or horizontally, or be vibrated; the inclination during movement shall be no more than 45°.

⚠ The appliance shall run continuously once it is started. Generally, the operation of the appliance shall not be interrupted; or otherwise the service life may be impaired

5 Trouble shooting

5. 1 You may try to solve the following simple problems by yourself.
If them cannot be solved, please contact the after-sales department.

No Power	<p>Check whether the appliance is connected to power or whether the plug is in well contact</p> <p>Check whether the voltage is too low</p> <p>Check whether there is a power failure or partial circuits have tripped</p>
Odour	<p>Odorous foods shall be tightly wrapped</p> <p>Check whether there is any rotten food</p> <p>Clean the inside of the refrigerator</p>
Long-time operation of the compressor	<p>Long operation of the refrigerator is normal in summer when the ambient temperature is high</p> <p>It is not suggestible having too much food in the appliance at the same time</p> <p>Food shall get cool before being put into the appliance</p> <p>The doors are opened too frequently</p>
No Light	<p>Check whether the refrigerator is connected to power supply and whether the illuminating light is damaged</p> <p>Have the light replaced by a specialist</p>
Doors cannot be properly closed	<p>The door is stuck by food packages</p> <p>The refrigerator is tilted</p>
Loud noise	<p>Check whether the floor is level and whether the refrigerator is placed stably</p> <p>Check whether accessories are placed at proper locations</p>
Door seal fails to be tight	<p>Remove foreign matters on the door seal</p> <p>Heat the door seal and then cool it for restoration (or blow it with an electrical drier or use a hot towel for heating)</p>
Water pan overflows	<p>There is too much food in the chamber or food stored contains too much water, resulting in heavy defrosting</p> <p>The doors are not closed properly, resulting in frosting due to entry of air and increased water due to defrosting</p>
Hot housing	<p>Heat dissipation of the built-in condenser via the housing, which is normal. When housing becomes hot due to high ambient temperature and storage of too much food, it is recommended to provide sound ventilation to facilitate heat dissipation.</p>
Surface condensation	<p>Condensation on the exterior surface and door seals of the refrigerator is normal when the ambient humidity is too high. Just wipe the condensate with a clean towel.</p>
Abnormal noise	<p>Buzz: The compressor may produce buzzes during operation, and the buzzes are loud particularly upon start or stop. This is normal.</p> <p>Creak: Refrigerant flowing inside of the appliance may produce creak, which is normal.</p>

This warranty is provided in Australia by Glen Dimplex Australia Pty Limited ABN 69 118 275 460 (Phone number 1300 556 816) in respect of the Baumatic product.

1. Baumatic Express Warranty

Subject to the exclusions below, we warrant that the product will not have any electrical or mechanical breakdowns within:

- a) In the case of Baumatic products used for personal, domestic or household purposes, a period of 2 years (AU) from the date the product is purchased as a brand-new product from a retailer located in Australia.
- b) In the case of Baumatic products used for purposes other than personal, domestic or household purposes (including business or commercial use), a period of 90 days from the date the product is purchased as a brand-new product from a retailer located in Australia / New Zealand. Baumatic Products are designed and intended for domestic use only; and
- c) All warranty repairs must be carried out by Glen Dimplex or their nominated service agent

Note: warranty periods detailed above may vary in line with agreements with select retail and builder partners.

The benefits conferred by this express warranty are in addition to the Consumer Guarantees referred to in section 3 and any other statutory rights you may have under the Australian Consumer Law and/or other applicable laws.

2. Warranty exclusions

This express warranty does not apply where:

- a) The product has been installed, used or operated otherwise than in accordance with the product manual or other similar documentation provided to you with the product;
- b) The product requires repairs due to damage resulting from accident, misuse, incorrect installation, insect or vermin infestation, improper liquid spillage, cleaning or maintenance, unauthorised modification, use on an incorrect voltage, power surges and dips, voltage supply problems, tampering or unauthorised repairs by any persons, use of defective or incompatible accessories or exposure to abnormally corrosive conditions, events independent of human control which occurred after the goods left the control of Glen Dimplex;
- c) The repair relates to the replacement of consumable parts such as fuses and bulbs or any other parts of the product which require routine replacement;
- d) You are unable to provide us with reasonable proof of purchase for the product;
- e) the breakdown occurs after the expiry of the express warranty period set out in section 1 or
- f) the product was not purchased in Australia / New Zealand as a brand-new product.

3. Consumer guarantees

Our goods come with guarantees that cannot be excluded under the Australian Consumer Law. You are entitled to a replacement or refund for a major failure and for compensation for any other reasonably foreseeable loss or damage. You are also entitled to have the goods repaired or replaced if the goods fail to be of acceptable quality and the failure does not amount to a major failure.

4. How to make a claim

To make a valid claim under this warranty, you must:

- a) Lodge the claim with us as soon as possible and no later than 14 days after you first become aware of the breakdown;
- b) Provide us with the product serial number;
- c) Provide us with reasonable proof of purchase for the product. This can take the form of a store receipt, new home handover form or other payment receipt documentation; and
- d) If required by us, provide us (or any person nominated by us) with access to the premises at which the product is located at times nominated by us (so that we can inspect the product).

5. Warranty claims

If you make a valid claim under this warranty and none of the exclusions set out in section 2 apply, we will, at our election, either repair the product or replace the product with a product of identical specification (or where the product is superseded or no longer in stock, with a product of as close a specification as possible).

Goods presented for repair may be replaced by refurbished goods of the same type rather than being repaired. Refurbished parts may be used to repair the goods.

Products are designed and supplied for normal domestic use. We will not be liable to you under this warranty for business loss or damage of any kind whatsoever.

6. Costs of warranty claim

Where you make a claim under this warranty, a Glen Dimplex authorised repairer may need to attend your premises to inspect the product. For products located in Australia, we may charge you a service call fee if a repairer will be required to travel outside the normal service area of more than 30 kilometres from the nearest Glen Dimplex service centre or authorised service agent to your location. You may obtain details on the location of our service centres and our service call fees by calling our customer care line on 1300 556 816 in Australia.

Glen Dimplex is not liable for freight incurred as a result of the appliance (or any part) being forwarded, collected or returned following repair. Such charges remain the sole responsibility of the purchaser.
